Eligibility Graduate and undergraduate students enrolled during the fall 2011, or who have graduated within six months of the Pacific Northwest Nutrition Conference, are encouraged to submit an abstract. Previous award winners are not eligible for prize money.

Awards

First Place	\$500
Second Place	\$350
Third Place	\$200

In addition to the prize money all award winners will be given the opportunity to speak at this year's conference and present their research findings in a five to ten minute presentation. All entrants must be prepared to make this oral presentation when they win.

Abstract Requirements Abstracts must describe research completed as part of the student's degree program. It is highly recommended that students take into consideration the applied nature of this conference when deciding the relevance of their work. Work previously presented at a national or international conference is eligible.

Poster Requirements Prepare poster according to the 2004 American Society of Animal Science Guidelines and Format. Work previously presented at another conference must be reformatted for this conference.

Postdoctoral Researchers You may present data in poster form but are not eligible for prize money.

POSTER ABSTRACTS

Pacific Northwest Animal Nutrition Conference
October 4th-5th, 2011

An important part of the 46th Annual Pacific Northwest Animal Nutrition Conference is the Graduate Student Poster Competition. This competition adds to the content of the Conference, permits universities to show aspects of their programs and allows graduate students to meet prospective employers.

Graduate students and postdoctoral fellows are invited to submit a one-page abstract that will be included in the conference proceedings.

The posters will be displayed on the afternoon of Tuesday, October 4th and will be manned for questions, discussion and judging at 5:30 p.m. during the student reception. Post boards provided will be 4 ft. high and 8 ft. wide.

Abstracts will be compiled directly into the Proceedings, so it is essential to adhere to the following standard format specifications.

1. The abstract must be one standard page with 1" margins on all sides.
2. Abstracts should use a serif font, preferably Times New Roman, in a 12-point size.
3. The abstract title should be centered and bolded.
4. The names and affiliations of all authors should follow, with one-line space after the title. The presenting author should be designated with an asterisk (*) and this author must be present at the conference.
5. The body of the abstract should follow, after a single line space. The abstract should be single-spaced.
6. Figures or tables may be included in the abstract, providing they and the text fit within the allocated one-page space and are sufficiently clear and dark to be legible after printing.
